Compton PC Local Plan Sub-Committee Report – October 1, 2022

Local Plan Part 2 Examination in Public

The timetable for the Public Examination of the Local Plan (part two) is as follows:

- Friday 30 September 2022 Deadline for representors to confirm participation in hearings.
 Cllr Ramsey Nagaty has confirmed that he will participate on behalf of Compton Parish Council.
- Friday 21 October 2022- Deadline for submission of Council and participants' hearing statements. The Local Plan Sub-Committee will prepare the hearing statement on behalf of the PC in conjunction with Cllr Nagaty. The statement will be circulated to the PC members ahead of October 21.
- Tuesday 15 November 2022- Examination hearings start

The Inspectors List of Matters and Questions focus on the following areas:

- The review mechanism for reducing affordable housing provision
- The requirement for 25% of affordable homes to be First Homes
- The requirement for a 20% increase in biodiversity in new developments
- Sustainable and Low Impact Development; Climate Change Adaptation; Carbon Emissions from Buildings & Renewable and Low Carbon Energy Generation and Storage
- Parking standards
- The cycle network

The Inspector appears to be concerned that the policy requirements in the Development Management Policies, including the requirements for first homes, a 20% net gain in biodiversity and electric vehicle charging infrastructure, could render developments unviable and compromise deliverability of housing development in the area.

<u>Surrey Hills AONB boundary review</u>

Natural England has carried out a technical landscape beauty evaluation of the areas to be assessed for the AONB boundary review. Karen Stevens wrote to Natural England with a request to see this study, but this request was ignored. A freedom of information request was therefore submitted to Natural England, but this has been declined.

GRA meeting

The Local Plan Sub-Committee was unable to attend the GRA meeting. However, a copy of the minutes is attached (Annex A).

The GRA has agreed to commission a report on building height and mass to submit to the Inspector for the examination of the Development Management Policies. GRA members are concerned that the 14-storey buildings proposed for new town centre developments would change the character of Guildford. The group needs to raise £5,000. It already has pledges amounting to £2,200 from six members, and Compton PC has been asked to consider whether this is something which it would wish to support.
